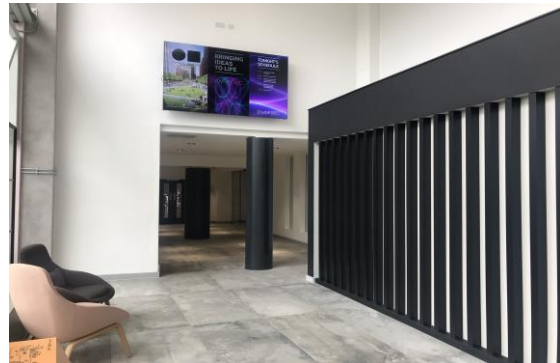


## Case Study: Oxford House

Sitting at the heart of Manchester's innovation district, Manchester Technology Centre's new home offers high quality multi functional workspace to suit business needs.

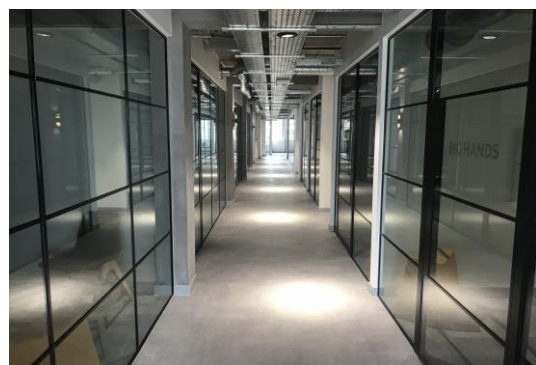
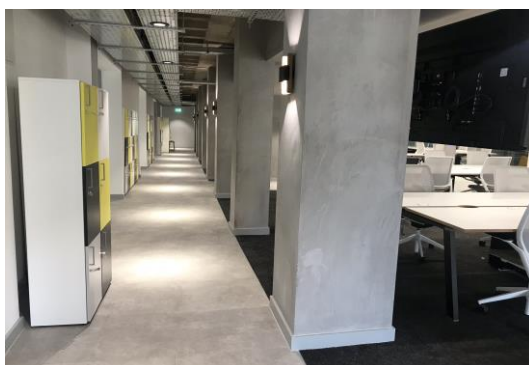


### The Challenge
